

The following is a list of items that scouts must/can have on campouts with Troop 512.

All will be in official Class – A uniform for travel to and from troop events. All badges and insignia must be properly placed on the uniform. Pack or frame must be used for getting gear from the jumping-off place to the campsite. Scouts must not use suitcases. Normal prescribed patrol equipment will be issued. Be prepared for an overnight hike as well as living in camp.

* **NOTE: Pants and Shorts must be NON-CAMO- Green NO Exceptions**

****Note: Required/prescribed medications must be turned in to the Troop Medical Officer. Scouts must keep track of their own needs and see the medical officer whenever they need these medications. Scouts may bring their own over the counter medicines (Tylenol, cold tabs, antacids, etc). These must be kept in their pack. Each scout is responsible for administering his own non-prescription medications.**

*****Note: At least 1 pair of shoes must be suitable for hiking – NO OPEN TOE SHOES.**

Swimsuit is required for summer camp. Carry it with you if you haven't done a swim test prior to camp as swim tests are done first thing upon arrival.
